### Typical profile of an Oxbridge application

- GCSEs Grade 7-9 is generally the initial grade profile.
- Personal Statement showing lots of work experience or wider reading
- Reference
- Predictions at A Level competitive with AAA to A\*A\*A
- Supplementary Questionnaire (especially Cambridge)
- Admissions Tests (depending on what you are applying for)
- Submitted written work (marked by a teacher)
- Interview
- ALL OF WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO SHOW POTENTIAL AND LOVE OF SUBJECT



### Structure of your personal statement...

- Must be over 90% academic.
- 4000 characters with spaces
- Must show what you've done beyond the syllabus. (work experience or wider reading is essential)
- We help at every step of the personal statement, one to one support is an essential element.
- Show engagement with academic studies. Why do you love them?
- Keeping it simple, doesn't mean simplistic, examples of what you have done will speak for itself rather than long words you do not usually use when writing.



## Marlborough College Interview Preparation Day



• We attend an annual Oxbridge preparation day at Marlborough College in Wiltshire. Here students will be involved in subject specific tutorials, group exercises with other students from other schools also looking at applying and also practise interviews with detailed feedback.

The Interview – we get you thinking about the questions you might get asked. Certain types of thinking skills will need to be demonstrated.

- **History:** Historiography Is History true?
- Maths: If I am in a room with five people and guess all their birthdays, what is the probability of getting only one correct?
- Theology: Is someone who risks their own life (and those of others) in extreme sports or endurance activities a hero or a fool?
- Medicine: If you could take a space ship to Mars, who would you put on it? What medical conditions would you be more and less likely to be confronted with?
- Classics: Is it fair that Ted Hughes won a literary prize for a translation of an Ovid poem?
- Physics: A container with liquid nitrogen is left in a laboratory, and its temperature is being recorded over a long period. The recorded temperature shows variations. Why?
- General; Tell me about a banana? Or; How much air is in this room?
